## 2008 Legislative Report

### H2020: PHARMACY BOARD; OMNIBUS

The list of exemptions from the state Board of Pharmacy regulation is expanded to include non-pharmacists who manufacture drugs under a permit issued by the Board. The requirement that persons who are licensed by the Board display their license in the location in which they practice is eliminated. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

### H2040: LIQUOR LICENSES; LOCAL RECOMMENDATIONS

If the governing body (city, town or county) disapproves of the issuance or reclassification of a liquor license, the license shall not be granted unless approved by 2/3 vote of the total membership of the liquor board.

### H2043: FY 07-08 HIRING & PROMOTION FREEZE (~~AIR QUALITY; IDLING; STUDY COMMITTEE~~)

Imposes a hiring and promotion freeze on all state budget units for the remainder of the fiscal year. Exceptions for "critical positions." Monthly reports are required from all budget units related to number of vacant positions filled and changes to the salary classification of any employees. Emergency clause. GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE SAID: the bill is "wholly unnecessary" since all executive branch agencies have been under a hiring freeze since her directive issued February 21, 2008. The judicial branch and state universities have likewise instituted policies to restrict hiring. She said the bill was an unwarranted intrusion into the constitutionally protected separation of powers among the three branches of government. The bill "adds nothing to the comprehensive, bipartisan approach" required to solve the budget deficit.

The annual date on which the county or special district officer in charge of enforcing air quality laws must submit a report to the governor and the Legislature regarding entities that have been issued an order of abatement or a renewal of an order is changed to October 1 from December 1.

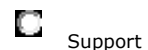

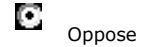
### H2065: AIR QUALITY; VAPOR RECOVERY; TUCSON

Metro Tucson (officially designated as vehicle emissions control area Area B) is added to the list of areas in which gas stations must install vapor recovery systems.

#### **H2066: SIGN WALKERS; MUNICIPAL REGULATION**

Beginning Jan 1, 2009, sign-walker regulation becomes a matter of "statewide concern." Municipalities must allow posting, display and use of sign walkers (defined as a person who wars, holds or balances a sign) and may adopt reasonable time, place and manner regulations relating to sign walkers. #### **H2088: MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY; VEHICLE EQUIPMENT**

Several changes to statutes governing safety equipment on trucks and buses, including a requirement that vehicles exceeding 30 feet in length must have a third reflector and a third side marker light mounted at the midpoint between front and rear reflectors, two stoplights are required for buses, trucks and truck tractors, and two red flags or lanterns (formerly only one) are required to be displayed at the rear of a load that extends four or more feet from the back of the bed or body of the vehicle. Also, repeals state laws regarding the maximum number of consecutive hours a driver of a commercial vehicle may be on duty. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

#### **H2165: EMPLOYER COMMUNICATIONS; RELIGIOUS; POLITICAL BELIEFS**

An employer or his/her designee shall not require any employee to attend a meeting sponsored by the employer or to participate in any communication with the employer that has a primary purpose of communicating the employer's political or religious opinion, unless the employer is required to do so by another law. An employee may report a violation of this statute to the Industrial Commission and may file an action in superior court within 90 days of the alleged violation. Establishes exemptions for religious organizations, political organizations and educational institutions.

Upon request of the director of the Dept of Environmental Quality, certain disclosures regarding a release or potential release of hazardous material shall be made available to the director and to the public. A person who violates this statute is subject to a civil penalty of \$5,000 per day for each violation.

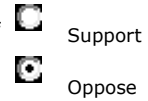
### H2289: LABOR ORGANIZATIONS; NONUNION EMPLOYEES; REPRESENTATION

If an employee is a member of a collective bargaining unit of an employer with which a union has a contract but the employee is not a member of the union, the contract may provide that the union may collect actual costs of grievance representation from the employee if the representation was initiated by the employee.

Removes lockouts from the list of actions that disqualify individuals from receiving unemployment benefits for a period of 1 week.

Before approving or disapproving a proposed development project that would permit the construction of retail superstores, a county or municipality shall prepare an economic impact report with a public agency or a private entity other than the permit applicant.

### H2306: ATTORNEY FEES; ZONING CHALLENGES

Permits attorney fees and costs to be awarded to a local governmental entity in any civil action commenced by a big box retailer to challenge the validity or application of an ordinance, rule, regulation or initiative measure regulating zoning. Applies to litigation filed or pending on or after January 1, 2009.

### H2317: LUXURY TAX; TOBACCO TAX STAMPS

During tobacco tax stamp compliance inspections, individual cigarette packages that appear not to have proper tax stamps are considered properly stamped packages if they are part of the same pallet or master carton as properly stamped cigarette packages and if the cigarette distributor or retailer has substantially complied with other tobacco tax laws. Effective on the date the Dept of Revenue notifies the Legislature that tobacco tax stamps are available to registered wholesalers. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

### H2334: FOOD PRODUCTS; SALE BY PRODUCERS (SALE OF BEEF BY PRODUCER)

The definition of "food product" in statutes related to the sale of food products by producers (e.g., at farmers' markets) is expanded to include beef and beef products, pork products, poultry products, egg products, and lamb and sheep products. Formerly, the definition covered only crops, swine, fowl, eggs and milk. [Capitol Reports note: Legislative research staff says food producers are statutorily exempt from being denied the right to sell or dispose of their products, and they cannot be subject to licensing or fees pertaining to the sale of their products. The director of the Dept of Weights and Measures shall adopt rules relating to bio-fuels. A retail seller of the ethanol blend E85 is not liable if a consumer miss-fuels and places ethanol E85 blend in a non-flexible fuel vehicle.

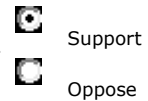
**H2366: DHS; LICENSING; ELECTRONIC LICENSING**

An application for an initial license or a renewal license to operate a health care institution, child care facility or child care group home may be filed in writing or electronically (formerly, only written applications were accepted). Removes requirement that DHS conduct a compliance inspection of a health care facility that applies for a license renewal; instead the dept must issue a renewal and conduct a compliance inspection at least once during each licensure period. Makes additional changes to statutes related to licensure of child care facilities and child care group homes. Effective April 22, 2008. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

The prohibition against commercial coercion or bribery in regards to spirituous liquor does not prohibit a producer or wholesaler from giving a licensee free electronic devices designed to record identification information for the purpose of preventing persons under 21 years old from purchasing alcohol.

**H2395: DUI; OUI (RETIREMENT; PSPRS; INVESTMENTS; MANAGEMENT)**

Would have made numerous changes to statutes governing operating a watercraft while intoxicated (OUI) and driving while intoxicated (DUI), including increasing penalties for OUI, requiring persons whose licenses had been suspended to complete an alcohol or drug screening, education or treatment program before the license may be reinstated, and changing the period of required use of an ignition interlock device to 6 months from one year if the person successfully completed a drug or alcohol treatment or education program. More. GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE SAID: it is premature to change the law regarding how long a person convicted of DUI should have an ignition interlock device installed on his/her vehicle. She said the one year period as established in legislation in 2007 has been in effect for less than a year, and no one can be certain of its effect on public safety.

An applicant for AHCCCS services or re-determination of eligibility shall identify that person's employer and the employer that person's spouse or parent(s). On or before November 15 of each year, AHCCCS shall prepare a list of each employer identified by applicants, the total number of employees employed by each employer and the total number of those employees and their spouses and dependents who are enrolled in AHCCCS. The list shall be provided to the governor, the president of the Senate, the speaker of the House, the Secretary of State and the director of the State Library, Archives and Public Records.

#### **H2425: UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS; ENERGY ACT**

Beginning January 1, 2009, any new underground storage tank (UST), new piping components installed on an existing UST, or new motor fuel dispensers connected to a UST must meet federal requirements. The Department of Environmental Quality may issue a stop use order and affix a stop use tag for any UST that is not in compliance. Owners or operators may request a hearing on stop use orders issued and may appeal DEQ decisions to superior court. Beginning Jan 1, 2009, delivering product to a UST that has a stop use tag is prohibited, subject to a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 per UST per violation. Beginning Aug 9, 2012, owners or operators of UST must designate individuals to undergo specified training. [Capitol Reports note: Legislative research staff says this bill is intended to bring Arizona statutes into conformity with federal law.] AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

H2425: UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS; ENERGY ACT 5/20 signed by governor. Chap. 218, Laws 2008.

#### **H2483: IGNITION STRENGTH OF CIGARETTES; REGULATION**

Cigarettes may not be sold in, or to persons located in, the state unless they have been tested and meet specified performance standards regarding propensity to start accidental fires. The manufacturer must also file a written certification with the state fire marshal and pay a fee of \$250 per "brand family" of cigarettes for every certification period of three years. Labeling requirements are also specified. Establishes civil penalties for violations of these regulations. Requires the fire marshal to implement these regulations pursuant to the implementation and substance of the New York Fire Safety Standards for Cigarettes and to review the effectiveness of these regulations and report to the Legislature every three years. The Legislature finds that, because these safety standards are of statewide concern, the statute preempts regulation by any political subdivision of the state. Effective August 1, 2009. Repealed if a federal reduced cigarette ignition propensity standard is enacted. Due to the increase in state revenue, this bill requires a 2/3 majority for passage (per Prop 108). #### **H2537: AIR QUALITY; MOTOR FUEL**

The dates between which winter blend gasoline must be sold in the Phoenix Area are changed from November 1 - January 31, from November 1 - March 31. The winter blend gasoline may contain less than 10% ethanol and this blend is not subject to certain emissions requirements. Conditionally enacted on the US Environmental Protection Agency approving a revision to the State Implementation Plan.

#### **H2581: PHARMACY AUDITS; REQUIREMENTS; LIMITATIONS**

Requirements are established for audits that are used to adjust payments to a pharmacy, including requiring audit procedures to be included in contracts and prohibiting the entity conducting the audit from receiving payment based on a percentage of the amount recovered. Clerical errors do not constitute fraud and are not subject to criminal penalties, but the cost of the errors can be recouped.

Beginning January 1, 2010, motor vehicle fuel taxes and use fuel taxes are adjusted annually by the percentage change in the gross domestic product index factor for Arizona. The fixed 13-cent use fuel tax for vehicles transporting forest products ends on Jan 1, 2010, and is replaced by the adjusted tax rate as provided in this act.

### **H2617: COMMERCIAL PROPERTY TAX; RENEWABLE ENERGY**

The list of real and personal property to be classified as class 2 property for purposes of taxation is expanded to include property and improvements used for specified commercial or industrial purposes on which renewable energy equipment is permanently installed and accounts for at least (blank in original) % of the property's total full cash value. These properties may not be classified as class 2 for more than 5 tax years.
